Greetings from Romania! We hope this letter finds you doing well and enjoying the blessings of the Lord. As we look back over the months of May and June, we are thankful for God's continued faithfulness and for your prayers and support on our behalf.

One of the biggest answers to prayer that we can share is that our visas have finally arrived! After many months of waiting and navigating the immigration process, we are now officially legal residents here in Romania. We praise the Lord for bringing this process to completion and are grateful to all of you who prayed with us throughout the journey.

Language school continues to be a major part of our ministry preparation. At times the progress can feel slow, but Emily and I are encouraged that we are making steady progress. Learning a new language is a challenge, but we know it is an important step in effectively reaching people with the Gospel and serving here long-term. We are thankful for the opportunities the Lord gives us each day to practice and improve.

Recently, Emily and I had the opportunity to help a visiting church group that came to minister in our area. They hosted a Vacation Bible School for Roma children in the village where I volunteer, and we were able to assist by serving a meal for the workers as well as helping some during the week. It was a blessing to see so many children hearing the Word of God and being shown the love of Christ.

The Lord has also continued to open doors for ministry in the village. I have been helping as an aide to a CPS worker through the Christian volunteer ministry with which we serve. We assist families in a variety of practical ways, but what has been especially encouraging is the opportunity to share the Gospel and pray with many of the families we visit. While much of this ministry involves planting seeds, I am praying that God will use His Word to bring conviction and that many will come to know Christ as their Savior. Please join us in praying that these seeds will take root and bear lasting fruit in the lives of the people in this village.

Now that our visas have arrived, we are also able to move forward with purchasing a vehicle for our family. As I write this letter, I am preparing to travel by train to Constanța to purchase a van that will better meet our family's needs and help us as we continue serving throughout the country. We are thankful for the Lord's provision in making this possible.

Looking ahead, we have several exciting ministry opportunities coming up in August. Our family will be attending both youth camp and teen camp. Emily and I will be serving as counselors, and I will also have the privilege of preaching and teaching several times throughout the camps. Please pray that God would work in the hearts of the young people who attend, that many spiritual decisions would be made, and that He would give us wisdom and strength as we minister.

Thank you for your continued prayers, encouragement, and faithful support. We are grateful to be laboring together with you for the cause of Christ here in Romania. May the Lord richly bless you for your investment in His work.
